




- Released an Indigenous Policy Framework in 2017
- Released a 2017 action plan titled, White Goose Flying, on how it will respond to 43 of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action











- To support reconciliation, the City has committed to educate employees about the history of the residential school system and its inter-generational impacts
- The City hosts weekly sessions where employees hear presentations from Indigenous persons with direct or indirect experience with residential schools



Edmonton

• 5,500+ employees have participated to date



- The City hosts celebrations on National Indigenous Peoples Day (June 21)
- The celebrations feature:
  - Educational seminars on local Indigenous practices and culture
  - Historical dances and song







- Entrance sign to the City is presented in both English and Cree language
- Treaty Six flag raised at City Hall in 2017
- FCSS hosts community workshops on:
  - Significance of smudging
  - History and awareness of Métis people







 Council approved a policy in October 2017 to commit to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Calls to Action



 The Town plans to change local signage to include translations in local Indigenous languages
